As a busy mom and wife, it is important to Annie to do work that she loves, but also have the flexibility for her children, especially during her husband's busy seasons. With her background in Occupational Therapy and past work experiences, Annie took a leap and started a sleep consulting business right from her home. Virtually all of the work she does is over the Internet. Annie says, "Having a reliable connection at our home has given me the freedom and flexibility to have the career I want without geographical limits."

A typical client interaction begins by the client initiation via website or

social media. Then, via email, they will schedule a free 15-minute sleep assessment which happens over the phone. Here she will explain her services in more detail and learn more about the client's needs. After the sleep assessment they will communicate more via email, and set-up a video consultation. This is where a consistent connection is vital. Annie explained, "If I don't have a strong connection and the video buffers or disconnects, that reflects on my business and the perceived quality of service I provide. I want my clients to have a great experience every time, which means I need a dependable internet connection."

So far, Zen Sleep Consulting is the first and only business of its kind in the state of North Dakota. "Dakota Central has helped me pioneer this line of work; I'm grateful to be able to provide this service right from home," Annie said. With a dream and Fiber-to-the-Home, Annie is able to run a professional business while raising a family in rural, small-town North Dakota.

A LETTER FROM OUR GENERAL MANAGER

Over the past few years, we have been expanding our service to the area North of Jamestown where there is little to no broadband service. We have been building facilities to the most densely populated areas as construction costs per location are extremely high in the less densely populated areas. We have continued to do this in stages as we have been internally funding construction. In 2018, we completed the projects to complete fiber construction on the west side of the Jamestown Reservoir and the Spiritwood Lake area.

In addition to the usual fiber construction to new homes and businesses during the summer, we will be concentrating on replacing approximately 1,400 Optical Network Terminals (ONT) located on customers' premises. We have been experiencing the failure of a series of ONT units that will cause other ONTs on the network to fail. We utilize a Passive Optical Network (PON) which has up to 32 ONTs connected off one fiber splitter. It is problem enough that the one bad ONT fails, but it also can cause the other 31 ONT's on the fiber splitter to fail. It's a time-consuming process for our technicians to locate which ONT is causing the failure as the problem may be temporary and intermittent. The manufacturer has recognized the problem in the series and offered discounted replacement units, but we still have the burden of the time to replace the units. Arranging appointments to schedule the replacement ONT is not always easy, so we appreciate our customers' patience as we work through the replacement process.





However, the job is not done as there are still many areas outside our designated service territories where broadband is minimal.

We are excited that we have been able to continue to expand our high-speed fiber-optic network to businesses and residents that are desperately in need of broadband service. We are hopeful to continue doing so to meet the needs of central North Dakota. Thank you for your past support and we wish you all a great year!

FRS GRANT PROGRAM

As part of its ongoing commitment to rural communities across the country, the Foundation for Rural Service provides annual grants for rural communities served by NTCA members. The goal of this program is to support local efforts to build and sustain a high quality of life in rural America.

Applicants may request grants in the range on \$250 to \$5,000. Each grant is a one-time award. Projects may be funded at a lesser amount than requested. Application deadline is September 13, 2019.

The foundation supports organizations and projects that fit into the following grant categories:

BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Entrepreneurship and job creation programs.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Outreach programs that promote technology learning and innovation. Programs that encourage rural development through arts and tourism.

EDUCATION

Technology in the classroom (computers, smart boards), curriculum development, extracurricular activities and distance-learning programs.

TELECOMMUNICATIONS

Broadband adoption projects; applications of broadband, including in healthcare, agriculture, and education; and technology infrastructure, such as community hot spots.

RDFC AWARDS GRANTS IN DAKOTA CENTRAL'S SERVICE AREA

Dakota Central Telecommunications is a member of the Rural Development Finance Corporation (RDFC). As a result, communities in our service area are eligible to apply for a grant of up to \$2,000 for community-based projects. RDFC is making these funds available in order that more people become aware of their larger loan program that funds community-based projects and non-profit entities with low-interest loans.

RDFC has recently awarded a \$2,000 grant to the Carrington Park District. The grant will be used to assist the Carrington Park District with the funding of painting the community pool. The Carrington Park District features various playground equipment, as well as volleyball, tennis, basketball, horseshoes, swimming, picnic facilities, softball diamonds and disc golf. Carrington Park District also offers camping on a first come, first served basis.

2019 RDFC GRANT PROGRAM

The Rural Development Finance Corporation (RDFC) is pleased to announce it has approved a 2019 grant allotment of \$2,000 per member-cooperative to be used to support community-owned entities, non-profits and community-based projects.



Eligible projects include community-owned businesses (café, grocery store, motel, other); community facilities (such as ambulance services, fire districts, recreation, hospital/clinic, community center, etc.); or community-based projects (such as school/youth projects, other) that benefit rural areas.
